A Gentle Way to Remember Together

Family members may remember the same pet differently. Each person may choose whether to write, draw, share a photograph, listen or take part another day.

Caregiver note: Use simple, honest language that fits the child's age and your family's beliefs. Do not require a child to speak, draw or complete the worksheet. Allow them to stop whenever they wish.
